With profound sadness, we announce the loss of our partner Mike Swiger.

Mike joined Van Ness Feldman in December 1985 and became a partner in March 1991. Throughout his career, Mike was known as one of the nation's premiere attorneys representing the hydropower industry and his passion and commitment to his clients was unparalleled.

Not only was Mike a tremendous practitioner, he was an even better colleague, friend, and mentor. We hold his family in our thoughts and will continue to honor Mike's many contributions to the firm.

Mike represented a broad cross-section of entities with interests in energy and water development before federal agencies and the presidential administration, the U.S. Congress, and the federal courts.
